Memorandum of Understanding between

Dr Peter Patel of 'Saving Lives' project of Rotary Club of Birmingham, Birmingham, United Kingdom (Founder, International Director & Millennium President of the Club)

and

Dr Rajashree Chavan, Principal of Seth Govind Raghunath Sable College of Pharmacy, Saswad, India

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets out the terms and understanding between Dr Peter Patel as the representative and founder of 'Saving Lives' Project – Rotary Club of Birmingham and Dr Rajashree Chavan representing Seth Govind Raghunath Sable College of Pharmacy, Saswad to become a partner of the Faculty of Disaster Medicine.

Purpose

This MOU is renewal of the MoU signed in September 2018 by Dr Ravindra Patil. The primary purpose of the MoU is to establish a unique and visionary international partnership for the Faculty of Disaster Medicine — India and the first College of Pharmacy in India. It aims to strengthen India's health care system for disasters/catastrophes by introducing a dedicated training for disaster medicine.

The above goal will be accomplished by:

- Becoming a full member of the Faculty and by joining our West India Faculty at Pune.
- 2. By introducing the concept of Disaster Medicine to Pharmacy students and other Pharmacy practitioners and education institutes.
- 3. Undertaking key measure to become a disaster resilient organization and contributing to UNISDR 'Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030' programme. (The Faculty and Saving Lives are members of this programme).
- Leading the way for introducing Disaster Medicine in the very important sector
 of Pharmacy education and health security.





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Additional bi-lateral purpose:

- Both parties shall work towards establishing dedicated training course(s) for Disaster Medicine for their organization and the region.
- Both parties along with other members shall work towards establishing or supporting Pune and Saswad/Jejuri Region Disaster Medicine Response Team(s) and strengthening the medical preparedness and response to disasters.
- The college shall work towards building a disaster resilient organization and support regional/city resilience to disasters with focus on health.
- Both parties shall work towards establishing a Centre of Excellence in training and research in Disaster Medicine where appropriate.
- Dr Peter Patel and International and National Clinical leaders shall work with the institute in delivering these objectives in conjunction with the institutes appointed leads.

Reporting

The Faculty has International Advisory Board and Indian national Clinical Advisory and Development Board/Groups. All College will have representation at regional Faculty level. Via the Regional Faculty level, the College shall have support from the National Advisory and Development Board/Group. Evaluation of effectiveness will be carried out by appointing independent experts from both international and national organisations.

Funding

This MOU is not a commitment of funds. Funding for training the trainers will be raised as required by the regional Faculty leads.

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Infrastructure resources and funding:

Responsibility of 'Saving Lives' - Rotary Club of Birmingham:

'Saving Lives' has 'ring fenced' funding for developing the Faculty of Disaster Medicine - India and Nepal. The 'Saving Lives' will fund:

- 1. UK costs for development and resource needs of the training modules (GBP 5000-7000/module).
- 2. UK costs of international trainers (GBP 10,000.00 per year).
- 3. International transport costs and subsistence of the trainers from UK or other destinations upto the nearest airport to the training centre in India (GBP 1200 per person per visit to India - upto 4 training visits of teams of 5 max allocated budget GBP 24,000.00).
- 4. Backfill costs of international trainers (GBP 2000.00 per week per person).

The above are minimum estimated development and delivery costs.

Responsibility of 'Indian Partner Institutes':

Collegeas Institutional partners will be responsible for:

- 1. Arranging digital platforms such as Zoom for all training and management meetings.
- 2. Resources and finance for all local development and delivery of the programme.
- 3. Should the programme expand to face to face training in Pune or Saswad, then the partner institution shall be responsible for transport of the trainers from and return to the regional airport, train or other landing stations
- 4. Provision of all training facilities and resources needed for training of trainers
- 5. Subsistence for the period of the training programme(see above).
- 6. Local transport from hotel to training venue and return, any other site visits related to programme for the period of training days.
- 7. The College has option of inviting Dr Peter Patel to become visiting Professor for Disaster Medicine. Dr Patel shall support the college in developing its curriculum for Disaster Medicine, deliver annual lecture and support

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development of dedicated programmes on Disaster Medicine with learning competitions.

Duration of the training programme:

Most training programmes shall be conducted via Zoom platform as jointly agreed timetable. Post Covid19 pandemic, face to face programme may be agreed which could run for 3 - 7 days depending on regional Faculty needs.

8. The College can opt for developing their own trainers or have access to trainers from West India Faculty. In some instances, the Faculty will provide fast track development to reduce unnecessary international travel costs.

Other costs and resources:

Regional institutional partners shall be responsible for provision of teaching and training facilities for their regional development of the programme. This will mainly include provision of lecture theatres, break-out rooms for workshops, flip-charts and audio-visual facilities. Regional institutional partners shall also be responsible for funding costs of any printing, photocopying and preparatory materials, local administration costs and provision of local support staff for the programme.

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Frequently Asked Questions

This MoU is to define relationship between 'Saving Lives' Programme of Rotary Club of Birmingham and Institution(s) who wish to participate as a member of the Faculty of Disaster Medicine.

1. What is the nature and purpose of the MoU?

The MoU is not a legally binding document. It forms the basis of agreed framework to work towards defined purpose (see above) in the document.

Is there any financial commitment in the MoU?

There is no financial commitment in this MoU.

- 3. What are resource implications?
 - a) All hospitals, medical colleges, health care organisations or other institutes (here after called institutions) signing this MoU to become member and/or partners of the Faculty of Disaster Medicine – India & Nepal will be responsible for resources or finances needed for their own institutions agreed programmes.

b) All institutions will be responsible for provision and appointment of appropriately qualified personnel to become trainers and/or clinical leads for the programme.

c) All institutions are expected to have or access to appropriate training/teaching facilities for the programme. In most training areas the need will be for suitable room(s) with capacity of upto 50 trainees with audio visual facilities, break out rooms for workshops and simulations. As there will be interactive learning, the size of room should be big enough for round tables for 10 people x 6 in addition to space for trainers. Emergency medicine training will require computerized simulation training facilities. Where such facilities are not available, the institution shall be expected to hire such facilities or have access to such facilities at other location.

Background

'Saving Lives' – a project of Rotary Club of Birmingham and their partners have launched the first Indian Faculty for Disaster Medicine in March 2015 from Pune, India. This is the first teaching and learning Faculty for Disaster Medicine in South Asia. Currently, there are three University based teaching programmes in the world – one in North America (MS in Disaster Medicine and Management program, delivered as a partnership between Philadelphia University and the Department of Emergency Medicine of the Albert Einstein Health Network), second one is in Europe (European Master in Disaster Medicine) and third course is based at London/Liverpool, UK (The London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine run diploma courses in tropical medicine, disaster, and humanitarian aid) A fourth teaching programme is being delivered by Society of Apothecaries of London (Course in Conflict & Catastrophe Medicine).

South Asian countries and other developing countries do not have the financial muscle and human resources of developed world to manage disasters. The health care in these developed countries is well established and resourced to provide both emergency care and post disaster health care. It is well recognised that while many developing countries have significant medical and health care expertise, there is clear absence of trained people in Disaster Medicine.

Just over 20 years ago Rotary Club of Birmingham established a partnership with Rotary Club of Pune Central and Rotary Club of Latur to support rehabilitation programme in Kilhari region of the Maharashtra earthquake. Following on from this partnership, Rotary Club of Birmingham has worked with several partners in India, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka in helping and supporting post disaster rehabilitation with focus on health care and public health. Based on the experience from this work, Millennium President of Birmingham Rotary Club, Dr Peter Patel, the project founder for these programmes formulated the concept of 'Saving Lives' – a programme focusing on education and training of the medical and healthcare Appendix 1 attached to this document and Disaster Medicine. on the Faculty of Disaster Medicine – India and Nepal.

There is significant body of evidence that disasters have greatest impact on developing countries including India. These include avoidable deaths or serious injuries, infections, poor health and rehabilitation, loss of homes, livelihoods, businesses, jobs amongst many other socio-economic indicators. Disasters also have impact on poverty reduction and this leads to further impact on the healthcare system of the country.

'SAVING LIVES' project and Birmingham Rotary with their current partner hospitals (see Appendix 1) proposes to establish partnership with a small number of key hospitals and/or medical colleges in India to introduce 'training of trainers' and a core training curriculum for 'DISASTER MEDICINE' in their regions.

At the launch of North Indian Faculty from Delhi in September 2017, following comments were made by key Faculty leads:

Dr Peter Patel, founder and international director of the programme said: "This initiative establishes India in the forefront of countries in the world that address disasters head on."

Professor Muzaffar Ahmed, ex-executive member of NDMA and ex- chairman, ethics committee, MCI, reiterates "Such programs are the need of the hour for India. We will make sure such programs are conducted in a systemic manner on a regular basis, covering all the aspects of Disaster Management".

Dr James O'Biren, Regional Director of Public Health NHS South West, is a founder member of this Faculty and has worked towards training officials for disaster preparedness for the Jagannath Yatra, Puri. He says "This is very important for the improvement of public health in India".

Dr James P Kingsland OBE opines "The extent of care needed for the preparation, support and aftermath of disasters requires a multidisciplinary approach which includes a primary (community) based service for the recovery, reablement and return to health of affected communities. This Faculty is rising up to the challenge". Dr Kingsland is the President of the National Association of Primary Care, UK.

Additional bi-lateral purpose:

- Both parties shall work towards establishing dedicated training course(s) for Disaster Medicine for their organization and the region.
- Both parties along with other members shall work towards establishing or supporting Pune and Saswad/Jejuri Region Disaster Medicine Response Team(s) and strengthening the medical preparedness and response to disasters.
- The college shall work towards building a disaster resilient organization and support regional/city resilience to disasters with focus on health.
- 4. Both parties shall work towards establishing a Centre of Excellence in training and research in Disaster Medicine where appropriate.
- Dr Peter Patel and International and National Clinical leaders shall work with the institute in delivering these objectives in conjunction with the institutes appointed leads.

Reporting

The Faculty has International Advisory Board and Indian national Clinical Advisory and Development Board/Groups. All College will have representation at regional Faculty level. Via the Regional Faculty level, the College shall have support from the National Advisory and Development Board/Group. Evaluation of effectiveness will be carried out by appointing independent experts from both international and national organisations.

Funding

This MOU is not a commitment of funds. Funding for training the trainers will be raised as required by the regional Faculty leads.

Infrastructure resources and funding:

Responsibility of 'Saving Lives' - Rotary Club of Birmingham:

'Saving Lives' has 'ring fenced' funding for developing the Faculty of Disaster Medicine – India and Nepal. The 'Saving Lives' will fund:

1. UK costs for development and resource needs of the training modules (GBP

- 2. UK costs of international trainers (GBP 10,000.00 per year).
- International transport costs and subsistence of the trainers from UK or other destinations upto the nearest airport to the training centre in India (GBP 1200 per person per visit to India – upto 4 training visits of teams of 5 max – allocated budget GBP 24,000.00).
- 4. Backfill costs of international trainers (GBP 2000.00 per week per person).

The above are minimum estimated development and delivery costs.

Responsibility of 'Indian Partner Institutes:

Collegeas Institutional partners will be responsible for:

- 1. Transport of the trainers from and return to the regional airport, train or other landing stations (egPune).
- Provision of reasonable good quality and safe accommodation of trainers (minimum of 3 or 4 star with good internet facilities) for the period of training programme. The training programme may require arrival of the training faculty upto 2 days before the programme and 2 days after the programme.
- 3. Subsistence for the period of the training programme(see above).
- Local transport from hotel to training venue and return, any other site visits related to programme for the period of training days.
- The College has option of inviting Dr Peter Patel to become visiting Professor for Disaster Medicine. Dr Patel shall support the college in developing its curriculum for Disaster Medicine, deliver annual lecture and support development of dedicated programmes on Disaster Medicine with learning competitions.

Duration of the training programme:

Most training programmes run for 5-7 days depending on regional Faculty needs. The College can opt for developing their own trainers or have access to trainers from West India Faculty. In some instances, the Faculty will provide fast track development to reduce unnecessary international travel costs.

Other costs and resources:

Regional institutional partners for East and North East India shall be responsible for provision of teaching and training facilities for the programme. This will mainly

Frequently Asked Questions

This MoU is to define relationship between 'Saving Lives' Programme of Rotary Club of Birmingham and Institution(s) who wish to participate as a member of the Faculty of Disaster Medicine.

1. What is the nature and purpose of the MoU?

The MoU is not a legally binding document. It forms the basis of agreed framework to work towards defined purpose (see above) in the document.

Is there any financial commitment in the MoU?

There is no financial commitment in this MoU.

- 3. What are resource implications?
 - a) All hospitals, medical colleges, health care organisations or other institutes (here after called institutions) signing this MoU to become member and/or partners of the Faculty of Disaster Medicine – India & Nepal will be responsible for resources or finances needed for their own institutions agreed programmes.
 - b) All institutions will be responsible for provision and appointment of appropriately qualified and medically trained personnel to become trainers and/or clinical leads for the programme.
 - c) All institutions are expected to have or access to appropriate training/teaching facilities for the programme. In most training areas the need will be for suitable room(s) with capacity of upto 50 trainees with audio visual facilities, break out rooms for workshops and simulations. As there will be interactive learning, the size of room should be big enough for round tables for 10 people x 6 in addition to space for trainers. Emergency medicine training will require computerized simulation training facilities. Where such facilities are not available, the institution shall be expected to hire such facilities or have access to such facilities at other location.
